Experience implementing MSM and transgender focused HIV programmes	FPA Sri Lanka gained considerable experience through the Sri Lanka HIV Prevention Project, a US\$6.7 million initiative which completed in 2015 and was funded by the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. Under this project, FPA Sri Lanka worked with 'most-at-risk populations', such as men who have sex with men, female sex workers, drug users, beach boys and people living with HIV, to realize the project objective of increased condom usage among members of these groups. FPA Sri Lanka achieved this through a country-specific behaviour change communication model where condom demonstration, distribution, STI and HIV awareness provision and increased access to health care services were key elements.
