



Thailand's progress towards ending AIDS in 2021

HIV prevention

- 98% of pregnant women living with HIV received antiretroviral treatments to prevent mother-tochild transmission of HIV.
- 92.2% of infant born to HIV-infected mother received a virological test for HIV within 2 months of birth.
- Number of people received oral pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) increase about 14 times from 2016 to 2021.




 1,212,200 people received HIV-testing and know the results, of whom 260,826 were young people aged 15-24 (21.5%).
